EDUARDO MARTURET - CONDUCTOR

EDUARDO MARTURET



Eduardo Marturet enjoys an active career on three continents; he is the Music Director and CEO of The Miami Symphony Orchestra and continues to guest conduct actively in Europe. He has made more than 60 CDs that range from the Brahms complete symphonic cycle to surveys of Latin America's greatest orchestral composers.

European orchestras with which he has had an active guest conducting relationship include Berliner Symphoniker, European Community Chamber Orchestra, Staatsphilharmonie Rheinland-Pfalz, RAI Symphony Orchestra, Danish Radio Symphony, Royal Flemish Philarmonique, Nordwestdeutsche Philharmonie, Gelders Orkest, Bohemian Chamber Philharmonic, Budapest Radio Symphony, Brabant Orkest, and Concertgebouw Chamber Orchestra in Amsterdam. In 2001, he led the Berliner Symphoniker on a 12-concert tour, sponsored by Deutsche Bank, of major South American cities including Caracas, Sao Paulo, Cordoba, Montevideo, Buenos Aires, Mexico City and Monterrey. A documentary of the tour was broadcast through the region by DirecTV.

Marturet has performed with some of the world's most celebrated soloists across a wide range of musical genres, such as Mstislav Rostropovich, Maria João Pires, Barbara Hendricks, Jean-Pierre Rampal, Maurice André, Paul Badura-Skoda, Jaap Van Zweden, Byron Janis, Salvatore Accardo, Aldo Ciccolini, Ivo Pogorelich, Philippe Entremont, Evelyn Glennie, Fazil Say, Alirio Diaz and Angel Romero.

He has also crossed into the worlds of jazz and popular music, conducting with greats like Arturo Sandoval, as well as iconic performers Dione Warwick, Gloria Estefan, Cheo Feliciano, Carlos Santana, The Wailers and Rita Moreno. His versatility and artistry have made him a sought-after conductor on the global stage, bridging the classical and contemporary music worlds with grace and innovation.

Born in Caracas, Marturet studied in Cambridge, England where he became firmly rooted in the European tradition, obtaining a degree in Piano, Percussion, Composition and Conducting which he studied with Brian Thomas, Franco Ferrara and John Carewe.

In 1979, he returned to Venezuela with a permanent position with the Orquesta Filarmónica de Caracas as Associate Conductor and later as Artistic Director to the Orquesta Sinfónica Venezuela, where he served in that position until 1995. Currently, he maintains a strong connection with the Venezuelan National Youth

Orchestra movement (EL SISTEMA), providing guidance and support to underprivileged children. In January 2025 he was named Honorary Artistic Director of the Orquesta Sinfónica Simón Bolívar by Music Director Gustavo Dudamel and El Sistema's Executive Director, Eduardo Mendez.

With the opening of the Teresa Carreño Theatre in Caracas in 1984, Marturet became its first Music Director. After three years of bringing challenging and original productions to the stage, he resigned from the Theatre to dedicate himself entirely to an international career, conducting in Italy, Greece, France, Spain, England, Denmark, Holland, Korea, Norway, Sweden, Germany, Czechoslovakia, Belgium, Canada and the United States.

He made his Asian debut with the Seoul Philharmonic in 2003, a year when he also opened the Chorin Summer Festival in Berlin and made his debut with the Buenos Aires Philharmonic in Argentina and the Florida Philharmonic in Miami. In 2006, Maestro Marturet received a Latin Grammy nomination in the category of Best Classical Album, for conducting the Berliner Symphoniker in "Encantamento."

Since 2006 he has been the Music Director and CEO of the Miami Symphony Orchestra, during his 19 year tenure Maestro Marturet has taken MISO into the world-class professional symphony of Miami developing a unique classical-crossover repertoire in alliance with great producers such as Emilio Estefan, Rudy Perez and Burt Bacharach.

In October 2012, he was named one of the "100 most influential latinos in Miami". The ceremony was performed by Fusionarte Association, Pan-American Foundation and Televisa publishing. This same year, in March, the flag of the United States was flown over the U.S. Capitol in honor of Eduardo Marturet, who received the Medal of Merit of the U.S. Congress in recognition for his outstanding and invaluable service to the community.

In 2014, Maestro Eduardo Marturet was selected as a Steinway Artist, a distinguished list of musicians that includes classical pianists like Lang Lang, jazz stars like Diana Krall, popicons like Billy Joel, and "immortals" like Irving Berlin, Cole Porter, Sergei Rachmaninoff, and Arthur Rubinstein. In 2018, The Miami Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Maestro Marturet, paid homage to the memory of Zaha Hadid, ARCHITECT – ARTIST – THINKER (b. 1950 in Baghdad, Iraq; d. 2016 in Miami, USA) with the premiere of his composition @Zaha's Place, a meditation on sound and space.

In 2019, was inducted into the Genius 100 Visions Group, "an active and engaged community of 100 exceptionally imaginative and impactful human beings. Genius 100 brings accomplished and compassionate minds together to reimagine the future – and to implement creative initiatives to improve it.

The organization is inspired by Albert Einstein's words: "A new type of thinking is essential if mankind is to survive and move toward higher levels," and it includes world renown luminaries like US Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, architect Frank Gehry, and conductor Zubin Mehta, all great visionaries [who] raise the bar on what is achievable within their fields. Collectively, in collaboration, they can make the impossible possible.

That same year, he conducted the recording session of the Miami Symphony Orchestra's soundtrack television series from Telemundo "La Reina del Sur"

Season Two who won a 2020 International Emmy for Non-English Language US Primetime Program. The creation of the soundtrack for the series second season was the result of the partnership between himself, and Marcos Santana, President of Telemundo Global Studios, who was also Show-runner and Executive Producer of the series.

Marturet was part of a historic event that took place on Sunday, Mar. 14, Einstein's birthday, when Astronaut Dr. Soichi Noguchi (JAXA, Japan Exploration

Agency) was inducted as a Genius 100 Visionary. During this historic event, Planet 9, an opus Maestro Marturet composed exclusively to be performed in space, was performed for this occasion. Marturet and many other Genius 100 Visionaries took part in this once-in-a-lifetime experience.

More recently, on July 4th, 2022, Mayor Francis Suárez from the City of Miami proclaimed MISO as the official symphony orchestra of the city of Miami. Marturet received the proclamation in a multitudinary event, with more than 10,000 people present at the Peacock Park in Coconut Grove. Recordings

In addition to the 30 albums made with the Berliner Symphoniker, there are also those made with the Radio Budapest Symphony Orchestra, Brabant Orkest, the Amsterdam Concertgebouw Chamber Orchestra, the Bohemian Chamber Philharmonic, Stavanger Symphony, the Czech Chamber Philharmonic and the Miami Symphony Orchestra.





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

DANIELANDAI



Hailed as an "Exemplary Leader" by the New York Times for leading members of New York m Philharmonic and Manhattan School of Music in Carnegie Hall, violinist Daniel Andai has shared his versatile artistry as a soloist, recitalist, chamber musician, concertmaster, conductor and recording artist in major concert venues in over 50 countries. He is a prizewinner of numerous competitions and soloed with orchestras around the world. Daniel Andai is concertmaster and frequent soloist of the Miami Symphony Orchestra (MISO) since 2010, where he also made special appearances for Genius 100 visionaries performing on a Holocaust surviving violin as part of the Violins of Hope collection, as well as JAXA Astronaut Soichi Noguchi's private induction to the Genius 100 Visionarynroster, courtesy of NASA, while he orbited Earth aboard the International Space Station.

He was concertmaster and frequent soloist of the Philharmonic Orchestra of the Americas in New York with whom he recorded multiple Billboard rated SONY Classical CD's, and appeared as guest concertmaster with orchestras in Mexico, Brazil, Switzerland, and France, section violinist of New York Philharmonic and Miyazaki Festival Orchestra (Japan), and worked closely with members of major string quartets, symphony, opera, and ballet orchestras from around the world. As an educator, he brings a multifaceted style of teaching, suited for students of all ages and skill.

Dr. Daniel Andai is Dean of the Music Division at New World School of the Arts (Miami, Florida) where he is the Chief Academic O"cer, responsible for operating a music partnership between Miami Dade College, University of Florida, and Miami Dade County Public Schools. He is Artistic Director of Killington Music Festival (Killington, Vermont), Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of Alhambra Orchestra in Miami. Previously, he served as violin professor and Marialice Shivers Endowed Chair in Fine Arts at University of Texas in Edinburg and served on faculties at Miami-Dade College and New World School of the Arts, in addition to over 30 summer music festivals. During this time, he worked with some of the world's greatest classical and pop artists.

He has served on boards and advisory boards, been invited to serve as a panelist for Jeb and Columba Bush's Arts4Life organization and has performed for numerous world dignitaries, including Hilary Clinton, Donald Trump, Lech Walesa, Al Gore, Benjamin Netanyahu, among others. He has performed with countless recognized artists in the pop and classical fields.

Daniel Andai is an alumnus of University of Miami (DMA), Manhattan School of Music (PS & MM), Lynn University (BM), New World School of the Arts (HS), Miami Dade College and Killington Music Festival.

YASMIL MARRUFO




Is a Venezuelan composer, music arranger, producer and multi-instrumentalist, born in Coro, State of Falcón. His passion for music goes back to the age of 4, when he could already play maracas, Venezuelan cuatro, and many other instruments his mother exposed him to. He was regarded as a child prodigy who sang and played any instrument set before him. His career began at about age 14, when he made appearances with various bands, dance orchestras, and Venezuelan folk groups in his native country, where he served as arranger, singer and songwriter. In fact, Yasmil stood out because of the versatility he showed when playing multiple instruments (Piano, Guitar, Bass, Venezuelan Cuatro, Drums, Percussion, etc.) in different styles of music.

ASTRID CELESTE



Astrid Celeste is a Miami-based Venezuelan singer-songwriter, born in Coro, Venezuela, who felt a calling towards music from a young age, influenced by her musician parents. Known for her soulful vocals and passionate melodies, Astrid is at her happiest in front of a live audience. Following her opening act for Brazilian singer-songwriter, Roberto Carlos, Astrid's live performances also found her sharing the stage with Gloria Estefan, Pattie LaBelle, Cyndi Lauper, and José Feliciano. In June 2024, she released her latest solo single "Millones" and is currently working on her debut album which is set to be released later this year.

CLAUDIA LÓPEZ



Is a Cuban-American artist, singer, songwriter, and producer from Miami, Florida. She always dreamed of being a singer-songwriter like her father and eventually earned a scholarship to Berklee College of Music to study contemporary voice and later completed her bachelor's degree at the University of Miami Frost School of Music's Jazz Vocal Program.

In 2019, Claudia released her debut single "Crazy," which she composed, arranged, produced, and recorded. Her first album, "Running Out of Time," followed in August 2021, and she is currently working on her sophomore album, set for release in 2025.

Beyond singing, she works as a recording session musician and runs C&C Productions, her Miami-based studio.

CARLOS CAMILO



Carlos Camilo is a Cuban/American Grammy Nominated and Latin Grammy Official Voting Member - pianist, singer, composer and producer hailing from Cuba and currently based in Miami.

At just 3 years old, Carlos Camilo began playing the piano. By the time he was 11, he was composing his own music. Today, he composes anything from smooth jazz to R&B and pop. In 2012, he released his first album titled Dim the Lights, which was a smooth jazz instrumental piano album and one he says has been his most influential.

"I like to give a positive vibe with my music, making the world a better place one song at a time," Camilo said.

Growing up in Cuba, his music is inspired by traditional Cuban flavor mixed with American music. From an early age, Carlos Camilo knew he wanted to pursue music seriously, and has since been influenced by artists such as Alejandro Sanz, Earth Wind and Fire, Brian Culbertson, Brian McKnight, Michael Jackson, Hans Zimmer and countless others.

Carlos Camilo cites his main musical influences as the people around him and his daily experiences. Most of all, though? Love.

"Love is a key player in my songs," he said. "I'm forever intrigued and passionate about its power and how influential it is to all of us. Without love, we're simply mechanical beings."

Today, Carlos Camilo mainly creates Smooth Jazz, R&B, and POP. He's released 50 albums, and 73 singles independently and had played his music all over the globe with other artists, including Spanish Latin superstar, David Bisbal, and International Salsa Singer "India", as well as Victor Manuelle. Currently, he's working on his own band called Carlos Camilo and the Live Dimension. All in all, Carlos Camilo hopes to make a living doing what he loves with creating music, and completely immerse himself in it.

RODNER PADILLA



4 times Latin Grammy Winner, 1 time Grammy Nominee Venezuelan bassist, composer, arranger and music producer.

In 2014 won his first Latin Grammy for his role as musician, producer and engineer on his very own group's album, C4 Trio + El Pollo Brito, "De Repente", one out off two nominations that year; in 2019 he won two Latin Grammy on "Best Arrangement" and "Best Folk Album" for "Tiempo al Tiempo" by Luis Enrique + C4 Trio, where he holds credits as band leader, producer, arranger, engineer and performer.

He also Co-produced the 2013 Latin Grammy Nominee Album, "Gualberto + C4" by C4 Trio and the legendary Venezuelan singer, Gualberto Ibarreto.

In 2018 he was nominated for the Recording Academy Awards (NARAS), on the album "Pa' Fuera" by C4 Trio + Desorden Publico".

As a recording session bassist, he is counting around 30 Latin Grammy nominee certificates now, and recently learned that has been nominated for 2018 Recording Academy Awards (NARAS), to be celebrated on next January in New York City.

His work has been reviewed in several specialized bass and music magazines such as "Musico Pro" (Colorado, USA), "Bass Musician Magazine" (Washington, USA), and "La Dosis" (Caracas, Venezuela). As a bassist, he has performed with some of the most important Venezuelans and international artists such as Gustavo Dudamel and the Simón Bolívar Youth Symphony Orchestra of Venezuela with Rubén Blades as special featuring in "Viva La Vida" concert in Caracas, 2013.

Also has been bassist for great artist like Oscar De Leon, Sergio George, Jose Alberto "El Canario", París Jazz Big Band, Franco de Vita, Gilberto Santa Rosa, Frank Quintero, Dave Samuels, Yordano, Jerry Rivera, Pedro Eustache, Gerry Weil, Huáscar Barradas, Ralph Irizarri, Rafael "el Pollo" Brito, Aquiles Báez, Soledad Bravo, Andrés Briceño, Pablo Gil, Nené Quintero, Luisito Quintero, Robert Quintero, Biella Da Costa, Orlando Poleo, Judy Buendia, Nelson Arrieta, Jorge Luis Chacin, Chino y Nacho, Nacho, Servando y Florentino, Lexestet, Linda Briceño, Alfredo Naranjo y "El Guajeo", Gualberto Ibarreto, César Orozco & Kamarata Jazz, José Luis Quintana "Changuito", Luis "Papo" Márquez,, Hana Kobayashi, Anais Vivas, Jorge Glem, Movida Acústica Urbana, Percussion Ensemble of Venezuela, Venezuelan Brass Quintet, Ilan Chester, Caracas Rhythmic Quartet, Elisa Rego, Vinilo Versus, María Rivas, and the international musical shows Venezuela Viva and Orinoco among others. His intensive activity as a bassist has earned him international awards, including Latin Grammy in 2011, with the "Treasures of the Venezuelan Music" from the famous Venezuelan artist Ilan Chester, in the category "Best Folklorico Album", He also won The Joropo International Tournament in Villavicencio, Colombia, in the category of "Best Ensemble New Format" with C4 Trio and "Best Bassist".

As a multi-instrumentalist, he had recorded Piano, Keybords, Melodica, Double-bass and Acustic Guitar in several productions for great artists, such as Rafael 'el Pollo' Brito, Frank Quintero, Jose Luis Quintana 'Changuito', Judy Buendia, María Alejandra Rodríguez, C4 Trio and many live performances.

Padilla has been on several international tours visiting and performing in Estados Unidos, Francia, España, Italia, Alemania, Bélgica, Inglaterra, Escocia, Holanda, Marruecos, Canadá, Colombia, Ecuador, México, Costa Rica, Perú, Cuba and other countries from Latin American and the Caribbean. He has also traveled around Venezuela dictating workshops about contemporary harmony as well as execution and improvisation of electric bass. In 2010, he was invited along with his group, C4 Trío, for giving a concert and some lectures in the prestigious Berklee College of Music in Boston, as a part of their USA tour.

ED CALLE



Born in Venezuela of Spanish parents, Dr. Ed Calle is the 2015 Latin Grammy Award winner for Best Instrumental Album, a five-time Grammy nominee, 2016 Pepsi Music Award nominee for best jazz album, and one of the most recorded saxophonists in history. Ed is featured on more than 1,200 CDs and almost of 9,000 singles with recording royalty including Frank Sinatra, Celia Cruz, Arturo Sandoval, Natalie Cole, Michael Bolton, Cristina Aguilera, Tom Dowd, Phil Ramone, Juan Luis Guerra, Chick Corea, Michael Brecker, Gloria Estefan, Juanes, Greg Allman, Lenny Kravitz, The Bee Gees, George Clinton, David Byrne, Rhianna, David Bisbal, the Pet Shop Boys, Julio Iglesias, and Oscar DeLeon. Calle* currently tours the globe as a featured soloist and with his jazz ensemble*, Mamblue*, Arturo Sandoval*, World Music 5, Miami Saxophone Quartet, Negroni's Trio*, 14 Jazz Orchestra, & the South Florida Jazz Orchestra. Active in and recognized by his community, Dr. Calle's accolades include 2018 South Florida Music Hall of Fame Nominee, www.facultyawards.org Best Professor Miami Dade College (2015), United Teachers of Dade Champion of Education for the Arts and Entertainment (2014), and King of Carnival Miami (2013).

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

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
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
