EDUARDO MARTURET



Eduardo Marturet enjoys an active career on three continents; he is the Music Director and CEO of The Miami Symphony Orchestra and continues to guest conduct actively in Europe. He has made more than 60 CDs that range from the Brahms complete symphonic cycle to surveys of Latin America's greatest orchestral composers. European orchestras with which he has had an active guest conducting relationship include Berliner Symphoniker, European Community Chamber Orchestra, Staatsphilharmonie Rheinland-Pfalz, RAI Symphony Orchestra, Danish Radio Symphony, Royal Flemish Philharmonique, Nordwestdeutsche Philharmonie, Gelders Orkest, Bohemian Chamber Philharmonic, Budapest Radio Symphony, Brabant Orkest, and Concertgebouw Chamber Orchestra in Amsterdam. In 2001, he led the Berliner Symphoniker on a 12-concert tour, sponsored by Deutsche Bank, of major South American cities including Caracas, Sao Paulo, Cordoba, Montevideo, Buenos Aires, Mexico City and Monterrey. A documentary of the tour was broadcast through the region by DirecTV.

Marturet has performed with some of the world's most celebrated soloists across a wide range of musical genres, such as Mstislav Rostropovich, Maria João Pires, Barbara Hendricks, Jean-Pierre Rampal, Maurice André, Paul Badura-Skoda, Jaap Van Zweden, Byron Janis, Salvatore Accardo, Aldo Ciccolini, Ivo Pogorelich, Philippe Entremont, Evelyn Glennie, Fazil Say, Alirio Diaz and Angel Romero.

He has also crossed into the worlds of jazz and popular music, conducting with greats like Arturo Sandoval, as well as iconic performers Dione Warwick, Gloria Estefan, Cheo Feliciano, Carlos Santana, The Wailers and Rita Moreno. His versatility and artistry have made him a sought-after conductor on the global stage, bridging the classical and contemporary music worlds with grace and innovation.

Born in Caracas, Marturet studied in Cambridge, England where he became firmly rooted in the European tradition, obtaining a degree in Piano, Percussion, Composition and Conducting which he studied with Brian Thomas, Franco Ferrara and John Carewe.

In 1979, he returned to Venezuela with a permanent position with the Orquesta Filarmónica de Caracas as Associate Conductor and later as Artistic Director to the Orquesta Sinfónica Venezuela, where he served in that position until 1995. Currently, he maintains a strong connection with the Venezuelan National Youth

Orchestra movement (EL SISTEMA), providing guidance and support to underprivileged children. In January 2025 he was named Honorary Artistic Director of the Orquesta Sinfónica Simón Bolívar by Music Director Gustavo Dudamel and El Sistema's Executive Director, Eduardo Mendez.

With the opening of the Teresa Carreño Theatre in Caracas in 1984, Marturet became its first Music Director. After three years of bringing challenging and original productions to the stage, he resigned from the Theatre to dedicate himself entirely to an international career, conducting in Italy, Greece, France, Spain, England, Denmark, Holland, Korea, Norway, Sweden, Germany, Czechoslovakia, Belgium, Canada and the United States.

In 1987, he received Official of the Order of Orange Nassau, by Queen Beatrix from the Netherlands.

He made his Asian debut with the Seoul Philharmonic in 2003, a year when he also opened the Chorin Summer Festival in Berlin and made his debut with the Buenos Aires Philharmonic in Argentina and the Florida Philharmonic in Miami. In 2006, Maestro Marturet received a Latin Grammy nomination in the category of Best Classical Album, for conducting the Berliner Symphoniker in "Encantamento."

Since 2006 he has been the Music Director and CEO of the Miami Symphony Orchestra, during his 20 year tenure Maestro Marturet has taken MISO into the world-class professional symphony of Miami developing a unique classical- crossover repertoire in alliance with great producers such as Emilio Estefan, Rudy Perez and Burt Bacharach.

In October 2012, he was named one of the "100 most influential latinos in Miami". The ceremony was performed by Fusionarte Association, Pan-American Foundation and Televisa publishing. This same year, in March, the flag of the United States was flown over the U.S. Capitol in honor of Eduardo Marturet, who received the Medal of Merit of the U.S. Congress in recognition for his outstanding and invaluable service to the community.

In 2014, Maestro Eduardo Marturet was selected as a Steinway Artist, a distinguished list of musicians that includes classical pianists like Lang Lang, jazz stars like Diana Krall, pop icons like Billy Joel, and "immortals" like Irving Berlin, Cole Porter, Sergei Rachmaninoff, and Arthur Rubinstein. In 2018, The Miami Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Maestro Marturet, paid homage to the memory of Zaha Hadid, ARCHITECT – ARTIST – THINKER (b. 1950 in Baghdad, Iraq; d. 2016 in Miami, USA) with the premiere of his composition @Zaha's Place, a meditation on sound and space.

In 2019, was inducted into the Genius 100 Visions Group, "an active and engaged community of 100 exceptionally imaginative and impactful human beings. Genius 100 brings accomplished and compassionate minds together to re-imagine the future – and to implement creative initiatives to improve it.

The organization is inspired by Albert Einstein's words: "A new type of thinking is essential if mankind is to survive and move toward higher levels," and it includes world renown luminaries like US Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, architect Frank Gehry, and conductor Zubin Mehta, all great visionaries [who] raise the bar on what is achievable within their fields. Collectively, in collaboration, they can make the impossible possible.

That same year, he conducted the recording session of the Miami Symphony Orchestra's soundtrack television series from Telemundo "La Reina del Sur"

Season Two who won a 2020 International Emmy for Non-English Language US Primetime Program. The creation of the soundtrack for the series second season was the result of the partnership between himself, and Marcos Santana, President of Telemundo Global Studios, who was also Show-runner and Executive Producer of the series.

Marturet was part of a historic event that took place on Sunday, Mar. 14, Einstein's birthday, when Astronaut Dr. Soichi Noguchi (JAXA, Japan Exploration

Agency) was inducted as a Genius 100 Visionary. During this historic event, Planet 9, an opus Maestro Marturet composed exclusively to be performed in space, was performed for this occasion. Marturet and many other Genius 100 Visionaries took part in this once-in-a-lifetime experience.

More recently, on July 4th, 2022, Mayor Francis Suárez from the City of Miami proclaimed MISO as the official symphony orchestra of the city of Miami. Marturet received the proclamation in a multitudinary event, with more than 10,000 people present at the Peacock Park in Coconut Grove.

Recordings

In addition to the 30 albums made with the Berliner Symphoniker, there are also those made with the Radio Budapest Symphony Orchestra, Brabant Orkest, the Amsterdam Concertgebouw Chamber Orchestra, the Bohemian Chamber Philharmonic, Stavanger Symphony, the Czech Chamber Philharmonic and the Miami Symphony Orchestra.

Eduardo Marturet has been a Steinway artist since 2014.

Eduardo Marturet has renewed his contract with the Miami Symphony Orchestra until 2032.

DANIEL ANDAI



Hailed as an "Exemplary Leader" by the New York Times for leading members of New York Philharmonic and Manhattan School of Music in Carnegie Hall, violinist Daniel Andai has shared his versatile artistry as a soloist, recitalist, chamber musician, concertmaster, conductor and recording artist in major concert venues in over 50 countries. He is a prizewinner of numerous competitions and soloed with orchestras around the world.

Daniel Andai is concertmaster and frequent soloist of the Miami Symphony Orchestra (MISO) since 2010, where he also made special appearances for Genius 100 visionaries performing on a Holocaust surviving violin as part of the Violins of Hope collection, as well as JAXA Astronaut Soichi Noguchi's private induction to the Genius 100 Visionary roster, courtesy of NASA, while he orbited Earth aboard the International Space Station.

He was concertmaster and frequent soloist of the Philharmonic Orchestra of the Americas in New York with whom he recorded multiple Billboard rated SONY Classical CD's, and appeared as guest concertmaster with orchestras in Mexico, Brazil, Switzerland, and France, section violinist of New York Philharmonic and Miyazaki Festival Orchestra (Japan), and worked closely with members of major string quartets, symphony, opera, and ballet orchestras from around the world. As an educator, he brings a multifaceted style of teaching, suited for students of all ages and skill.

Dr. Daniel Andai is Dean of the Music Division at New World School of the Arts (Miami,

Florida) where he is the Chief Academic Officer, responsible for operating a music partnership between Miami Dade College, University of Florida, and Miami Dade County Public Schools. He is Artistic Director of Killington Music Festival (Killington, Vermont), Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of Alhambra Orchestra in Miami. Previously, he served as violin professor and Marialice Shivers Endowed Chair in Fine Arts at University of Texas in Edinburg and served on faculties at Miami-Dade College and New World School of the Arts, in addition to over 30 summer music festivals. During this time, he worked with some of the world's greatest classical and pop artists.

He has served on boards and advisory boards, been invited to serve as a panelist for Jeb and Columba Bush's Arts4Life organization and has performed for numerous world dignitaries, including Hilary Clinton, Donald Trump, Lech Walesa, Al Gore, Benjamin Netanyahu, among others. He has performed with countless recognized artists in the pop and classical fields.

Daniel Andai is an alumnus of University of Miami (DMA), Manhattan School of Music (PS & MM), Lynn University (BM), New World School of the Arts (HS), Miami Dade College and Killington Music Festival.

TATIANA GUIRIBITEY



Taty Guiribitey, affectionately known as “La Mamilover,” is a Cuban philanthropist based in Miami whose humanitarian work has impacted vulnerable communities in the Dominican Republic, the U.S., and Europe. As President of the Guiribitey Family Foundation and board member of the Adam Smith Center, she has led initiatives focused on education, health, and children’s welfare, supporting organizations such as Angels for Humanity, St. Jude, Nicklaus Children’s Hospital, and Maestro Cares. Known for blending fashion, art, and philanthropy, she has received numerous accolades, including the 2025 MISO Golden Baton Award, the Rockstar Award, and the Orion Cannes Personality of the Year. Her perseverance, generosity, and influence continue to inspire others to believe in personal growth and the power of doing good.

LUIS GÓMEZ - IMBERT



Luis Gómez-Imbert born in Caracas, Venezuela is a very active double bassist. Luis Gómez-Imbert studied double bass with Je' Bradetich, Bertram Turetzky, Gary Karr, Frantisek Posta, David Walter and Edgar Meyer among others. He graduated Summa Cum Laude from Northwestern University in 1988.

Gómez-Imbert has also studied the orchestral literature with Warren Benfield and Joseph Guastafeste of the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Edwin Barker of the Boston Symphony Orchestra; and Harold Robinson of the Philadelphia Orchestra.

Soon after graduating, he was presented along with his former professor Gary Karr on an ABC Good Morning America broadcast in the summer of 1988. Since then he has toured extensively through the Americas and Europe as a double bass soloist. Gómez-Imbert has played along with famous bassists such as Je' Bradetich, Bertram Turetzky, Lucas Drew, with whom he premiered a concert for two basses in Venezuela and subsequently performed it at the Double Bass World Convention held at Indiana University in 1994.

Luis Gómez -Imbert is also active in several professional musical organizations from the South Florida area and regularly participates in chamber music concerts. He has been associated to the Atlantic Classical Orchestra as principal bass under the baton of Stewart Robertson. Gómez-Imbert has been an advocate for the performance of new works and many of them have been dedicated to him or composed at his request. Several of those were performed in North and South America, as well as in Europe, where he has been invited to play in different new music festivals in France, Austria, Italy, Spain and in the Americas. Mr. Gomez-Imbert was appointed as principal bass for the Miami Symphony Orchestra since 2013 by Maestro Eduardo Marturet.

He has premiered pieces from composers such as Celestial Voices by Orlando Jacinto Garcia, Alexandro Rodriguez, Juan Francisco Sanz, Domingo Sanchez-Bor, Roberto Cedeño, Mauricio Rodriguez and many more. He will play the world premiere of Love and Betrayal in March 2017 with the Miami Symphony. This concerto is based on the themes for the opera Carmen by Bizet.

Gómez-Imbert has recorded for the Lyric and OO labels. One of those recording was awarded the Contemporary Record Society's "1992 New Recording of the Year" by a panel that included famous composers George Crumb and Milton Babbitt, as well as virtuoso cellist Yo Yo Ma.

Luis Gómez-Imbert joined the music faculty of Florida International University in the fall of 1994 as professor of Double Bass Studies and director of the FIU New Music Ensemble. His innovative teaching and performing style found an ideal venue to teach a varied group of American and international students, many of whom have performed in numerous professional musical ensembles throughout the South Florida area, as well as internationally. Recently, Mr. Gómez-Imbert premiered Love and Betrayal, a double bass double concerto along Chi-Chi Nwanoku and the Miami Symphony under the direction of Eduardo Marturet. The work composed by Cuban composer Mauricio Rodriguez was performed March 19, 2017 at the Arsht Center in Miami and it was well-received by the audience in attendance that day. Additionally, Mr. Gomez-Imbert has premiered double bass concertos along side Je' Bradetich, Bertram Turetzky, Dr. Lucas Drew and Yung-Chia Wei.

Currently, Luis Gomez-Imbert is quite active teaching and using technology both at Florida International University and also with his private language project: Babelia and a video recording project of new music written for double bass projected to be launched Fall 2018.

The Babelia language project in partnership with Aisha Linke and a great team of developers will launch during Summer of 2019. It is a very ambitious interactive project designed to teach German, French, Italian, Spanish and English to language learner throughout the world with the use of technology and animation.

CARLOS CUEVAS



Carlos Cuevas' music career spans 4 decades. His experience as pianist, keyboardist, composer, arranger, and producer has allowed him to explore virtually every musical avenue and to be equally at home on-stage and in the studio.

Carlos holds a Bachelor of Music from the University of North Texas and a Master of Music from The Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College, The City University of New York, where he was the recipient of the prestigious Sir Roland Hanna Memorial Jazz Award.

His versatility has been put to work with the likes of NEA Jazz Master, Hubert Laws (for whom Carlos has performed with for the last 23 years), Bette Midler, Engelbert Humperdinck, The Los Angeles Symphonic Jazz Orchestra, and New York's Philharmonic Orchestra of the Americas, to name a few. His arranging skills are also in high demand. Carlos has composed and arranged music for a wide variety of styles and ensembles that range anywhere from small group to big band and symphony orchestra.

As a leader, Carlos has released two albums. "DEPICTION" and "UNINHIBITED REALM". Both albums have been praised by Downbeat, Keyboard, Modern Drummer, & Músico Pro magazines, as well as The Los Angeles Jazz Scene, and CDBaby.com.

Carlos makes his home in New York City where he has performed at prestigious venues such as Carnegie Hall and Jazz at Lincoln Center. He is a sought-after arranger, studio musician, producer, and educator. For more info, go to www.carloscuevas.net

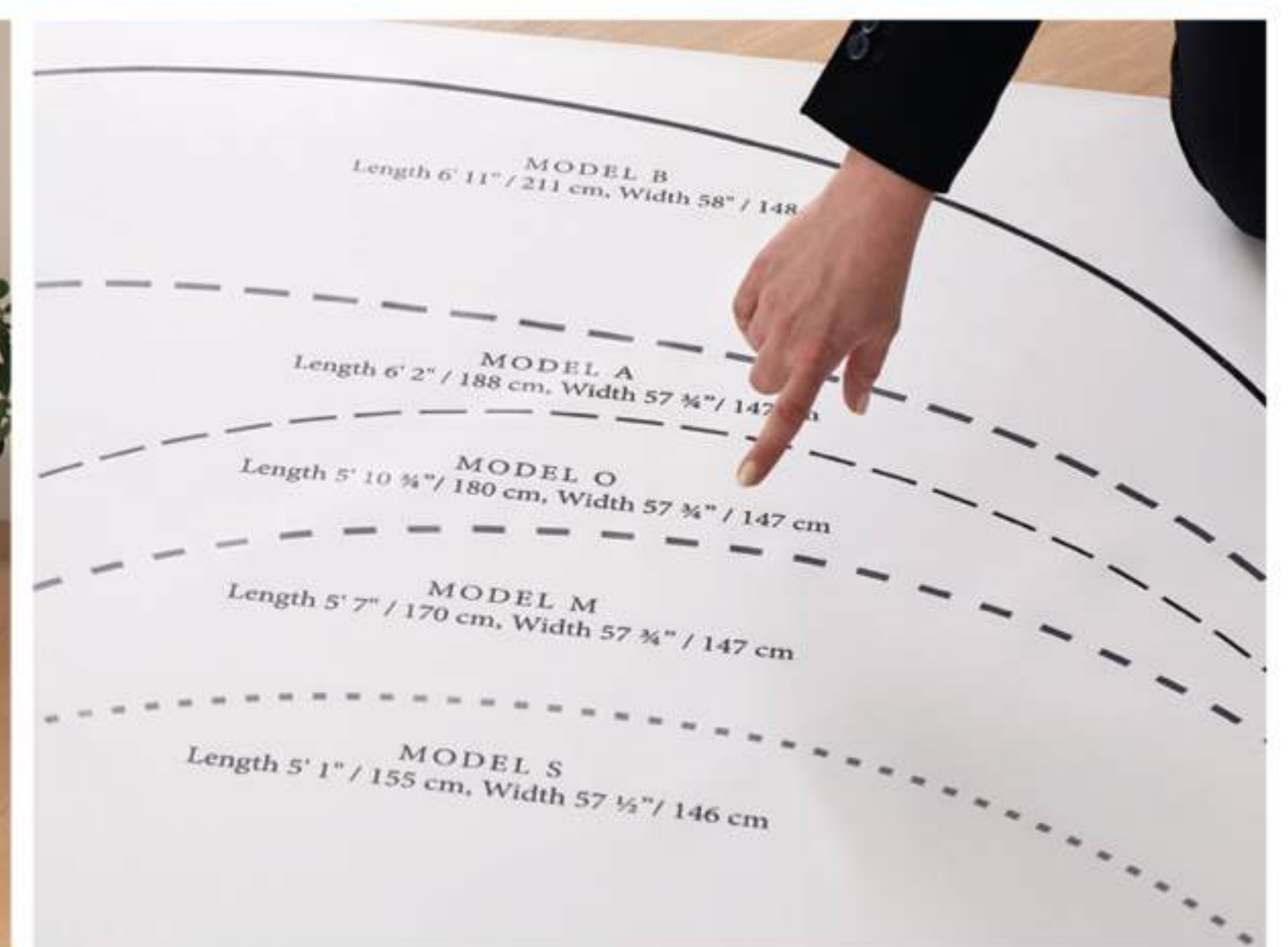

PROGRAM NOTES

Benjamin Britten (1913–1976)

The Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra, Op. 34 (1945) (Variations and Fugue on a Theme of Henry Purcell)

Composed in 1945 for an educational film introducing orchestral instruments, *The Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra* has become one of the most beloved and enduring works in the concert repertoire. With brilliance, clarity, and wit, Benjamin Britten transforms a teaching tool into a vibrant and virtuosic showcase of the symphony orchestra.

The work is built on a noble theme by the Baroque composer Henry Purcell, drawn from his incidental music to *Abdelazer*. Britten first presents this theme in full orchestral grandeur before embarking on a series of variations, each highlighting a different section of the orchestra.

The journey begins with the woodwinds—flute, oboe, clarinet, and bassoon—each instrument stepping into the spotlight with its own distinct color and personality. The strings follow, from the brilliance of the violins to the rich depth of the cellos and double basses, demonstrating their expressive range. Brass instruments then enter with bold, commanding energy, while the percussion section adds rhythmic vitality and dramatic flair.

Each variation not only showcases individual instruments but also reveals Britten's exceptional orchestration, allowing listeners to hear how the orchestra functions both as a collection of unique voices and as a unified whole.

The work culminates in a dazzling fugue, a form rooted in Baroque tradition, where a lively theme is passed rapidly between instruments in intricate counterpoint. As the fugue builds in intensity and complexity, the original Purcell theme returns triumphantly in the full orchestra, bringing the piece to a thrilling and majestic conclusion.

Accessible yet sophisticated, educational yet deeply musical, *The Young Person's Guide to the Orchestra* remains a brilliant celebration of orchestral color and craftsmanship. It invites audiences of all ages to listen more closely, discovering the individuality of each instrument while experiencing the extraordinary power of the orchestra as a whole.

PROGRAM NOTES

Chick Corea (1941–2021)

**Double Bass Concerto
Arranged for Double Bass and Orchestra
by Eduardo Marturet and Mika George**

Few artists have shaped the landscape of modern music as profoundly as Chick Corea. A visionary pianist and composer, Corea moved seamlessly between jazz, classical, and avant-garde traditions, creating a body of work defined by rhythmic vitality, harmonic richness, and boundless imagination.

This Double Bass Concerto—presented here in a special arrangement for symphony orchestra by Maestro Eduardo Marturet and Assistant Conductor Mika George—embodies that spirit of musical fusion. Reimagined for the concert stage, the work places the double bass at the forefront, transforming an instrument often associated with harmonic support into a virtuosic and expressive solo voice.

The concerto draws on Corea's signature language: syncopated rhythms, lyrical improvisatory lines, and a vibrant dialogue between soloist and ensemble. Throughout the work, the bass navigates a wide expressive range—from warm, singing melodies to agile, rhythmically driven passages—highlighting both its technical possibilities and its deeply human voice.

Marturet and George's orchestral arrangement expands the palette of the original material, weaving the colors of the symphony orchestra into Corea's jazz-inspired framework. The result is a dynamic conversation between genres, where classical structure meets the spontaneity and freedom of jazz. Orchestral textures alternate between shimmering transparency and full, rhythmic propulsion, supporting and challenging the soloist in equal measure.

At its core, this concerto is a celebration of collaboration and musical dialogue—between soloist and orchestra, between jazz and classical traditions, and between past and present. It reflects a distinctly contemporary vision of the concerto form: one that embraces diversity of style, cultural exchange, and the evolving voice of today's symphonic stage.

In bringing this work to life, The Miami Symphony Orchestra continues its commitment to innovation and to presenting music that resonates with the vibrant, multicultural identity of Miami—where boundaries blur and new artistic possibilities emerge.

PROGRAM NOTES

Johannes Brahms (1833–1897)

Symphony No. 2 in D major, Op. 73 (1877)

Composed during the summer of 1877 in the idyllic lakeside town of Pörschach, Austria, Brahms's Symphony No. 2 reflects a striking contrast to the intensity and long gestation of his First Symphony. Where the First was often described as stormy and monumental, the Second unfolds with warmth, lyricism, and an almost pastoral serenity—earning it the affectionate nickname of Brahms's "Pastoral Symphony."

Yet beneath its sunlit surface lies the composer's characteristic depth and complexity. Brahms himself jokingly warned friends that the symphony was so melancholic that "you will not be able to bear it," a remark that hints at the subtle shadows woven into its otherwise radiant texture.

The symphony opens with a gentle and flowing theme introduced by the cellos and basses, setting a tone of natural ease. Throughout the first movement, Brahms masterfully balances expansiveness with structural discipline, allowing melodies to evolve organically while maintaining a firm architectural framework.

The second movement (*Adagio non troppo*) moves into more introspective territory. Rich, dark sonorities and long lyrical lines create a sense of quiet contemplation, revealing Brahms's gift for emotional nuance. This is followed by a graceful third movement (*Allegretto grazioso*), which offers a lighter, almost dance-like character, full of charm and delicate rhythmic play.

The finale bursts forth with joyful energy. What begins with a sense of restraint quickly blossoms into a triumphant and exuberant conclusion, as Brahms unleashes a radiant cascade of sound. The symphony closes in a spirit of unambiguous optimism, a rare and exhilarating moment in Brahms's orchestral output.

Premiered in Vienna later that same year, the work was immediately embraced by audiences and critics alike, solidifying Brahms's place as one of the great symphonists of the Romantic era. Today, Symphony No. 2 remains beloved for its balance of lyric beauty, emotional depth, and masterful craftsmanship—an enduring testament to Brahms's ability to fuse classical form with profound expressive warmth.
